



EXHIBITION OF TRADITIONAL FOOD AND HANDICRAFTS

An exhibition of traditional food and handicrafts took place in Knez Mihajlo street in Belgrade. This was a promotion of local brands named 'Serbia in Belgrade' organised by Ethno Network in cooperation with NALED.

Belgraders and tourists could taste and buy traditional specialties from all around Serbia – Sombor cheese, kačkavalj cheese from Stara planina, honey from Fruška Gora and Homolje, ajvar from Leskovac, prunes from Osečina, Valjevo duvan čvarci (shredded pork), Lemeš kulen sausage, raspberries from Arilje and kajmak (raw cream) from Užice.

The event was opened by city manager Goran Vesic and H.E. Julia Feeney, the Australian ambassador to Serbia. The official opening ceremony was attended by mayors and other officials from Pirot, Sombor, Indija, Leskovac, Pančevo, Loznica and other cities and municipalities.
